What is Blended Learning?

How does blended learning work?

Blended Learning (Online Distance with Work Placement) allows you to work at your own pace in the comfort of your own home.



At ACC, we aim to tailor training to your needs. Our Blended Learning mode means you can access all learning materials at your home online (through Cloud Assess) and our course is developed so you set the pace for your own learning. Your ACC trainer is available for support by phone, email, additional support meetings or through our online learning platform.

Topics you will cover in your course include Child Development of Children 0-6 years, Program Development, Health and Safety, Communication, Guiding Children's Behaviour, Legal and Ethical Frameworks. In addition, you are required to undertake 160 hours of workplace training to complete your course.

The CHC30125 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care Qualification



The Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care comprises of 17 units and is the minimum requirement to now work in Children's Services. The quality of care and education we provide to young children relies heavily on the level of training undertaken by staff. To maintain quality care, Children's Services prefer to employ staff with formal training.

This qualification is Nationally Recognised and approved by ACECQA. Under the

Education and Care Services National Law (2011) the Australian Children’s Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) publishes lists of approved Early Childhood Education and Care qualifications and information regarding regulatory requirements at: www.acecqa.gov.au.

The CHC30125 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care provides a fabulous introduction to Children’s Services and is suitable for anyone considering a rewarding career in childcare. Depending on the setting, you may work under direct supervision or autonomously. In some settings, you may also have limited supervisory responsibilities of volunteers.

Upon completion of CHC30125 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care you will be referred to as an Educator. CHC30125 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care is a Nationally Accredited Course which covers children 0-6 years.

General Course Entry Requirements

Are there any entry requirements for the CHC30125 Course?

To support a successful study experience at Atkinson Child Care, students are required to meet the following general entry requirements:

1. Unique Student Identifier:

All learners are required to obtain a Unique Student Identifier (USI) should their enrolment application be successful. The USI links to an online account which contains all records of training results that a person has completed from 01 January 2015 onwards. Atkinson Child Care will not be able to issue any formal documentation i.e. Statement of Attainments, or Qualifications if the learner does not supply a USI. 2. Computer Literacy:

All students must have basic computer skills and have access to the Internet and a personal email account.

3. Working with Children Check:

For all students over the age of 18 you must also hold the relevant Working with Children's Check for your State. Completing Work Placement in any regulated Children's Service means you will be required to complete a Working with Children Check. You will be required to gain this check prior to enrolment.

Please note: You are unable to be employed in Children's Services as primary contact staff (included in ratio care) as a Cert III until 18 years of age however you can still be employed prior to 18 years.

You can also complete your Diploma prior to 18 years and work in a variety of other services including Nanny Australia and overseas, Kids Clubs, Crèche, Family Services or continue to enrol in further qualifications at University.

4. Language, Literacy and Numeracy Assessment:

In order for a student to enrol in our CHC30125 course they must successfully complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy Assessment prior to their enrolment being accepted. ACSF Level 3- 4 is required. Details available in Community Services foundation skills implementation guide available at:

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQS)

What is it like learning with us?

Your training experience with us will be nothing like you have experienced in your school life or maybe in any other training you have undertaken! This is Adult Education and as such, you will be treated and respected as an adult.

All of your trainers are trained Early Childhood and Adult Educators and our motto is to practice what we preach. We will be teaching you how to provide positive learning experiences for children 0-6 years. Likewise, we provide you with a positive learning experience. Our face to face sessions are hands on, practical and we encourage group work and discussion. We respect and support each individual and provide an environment in which you feel comfortable to learn and practice new skills.



What Is Competency Based Learning?

All courses are competency based. You show competency in each unit by submitting assessment tasks followed by being assessed in the workplace. **There are no exams.** You are deemed competent or not yet competent. If you are not yet competent, your ACC trainer will give you additional training and you are then able to re-submit your assessment task. During your course you are assessed working with children, which happens during workplace experience in a Regulated Education and Care Service.

Who Will Be Teaching Me?

ACC Trainers hold Bachelor and/or Masters Degrees in Early Childhood Education. All have taught adults in a variety of settings from community colleges through to universities and all have formal Adult Education Qualification.

They are all well-known and well respected within the profession with over 20 years' experience in teaching both children and adults.

How long will the CHC30125 course take?

As all blended online distance education is self-paced, you can go as fast as you prefer. To ensure all our learners graduate with the latest knowledge and research, a time frame is set in which learners need to complete their course. Below indicates the approximate time frame for completion of each course based on one unit per month.

How will I access my course resources and assessments?

At ACC we use Cloud Assess as our online learning platform. Here you will find all of your learning materials, assessments and other resources such as videos to help with your study.

All of your books (Learning Guides) are in PDF which means you can read on screen or download and print. The choice is yours. Worried about using the platform? That's all right – that's why we are here to help!



You will need access to a computer and internet to complete your course.

Is support available if I have difficulty with the course?

Your trainers are always there to help as required. You can call Monday to Friday between 9am to 4pm to access support from a trainer or send an email. You can even make a time to come in and see your trainer for a face to face meeting at our college or we can conduct online meetings with you.

Does your course cater for students with additional needs?

Yes, absolutely. As part of our commitment to access and equity we will do all we can to assist you in your learning. Telling us about your additional needs upon enrolment will allow us to work together with you to best modify the environment and training to accommodate your needs.

Do you offer Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)?

Are you already working in the field or have previous experience with children?

Please talk to us about RPL. You may want to enter through our RPL workplace assessment program.

RPL is the acknowledgement of skills and knowledge obtained through:

- Work experience
- Life experience
- Formal training
- Informal training



At ACC we recognise that learning takes place in variety of settings. The RPL process

involves you gathering evidence of your past experiences and qualifications. We then match this to the course competencies for relevance and currency. If you are able to show current knowledge and skills in a particular unit or part of a unit, you will not be required to undertake that part of the training as you are deemed 'competent'. Course costs are adjusted accordingly. Please note that skills and knowledge need to be current and some units in Children's Services' courses may still require demonstration of specific skills in the workplace.

Do I need to do Work Experience?

Experience with children and in Children's Services is important in assisting you to transfer your theory into practice.

All Children's Services courses require workplace experience and assessment in a regulated Children's Service. If you work in the field, your paid employment is counted as workplace experience and you can be enrolled in our Employment Based Course. We organise your work placement for you and always try to find a placement to meet your needs such as transport etc.



You are required to undertake 160 hours work placement in a 0-3 years setting in a regulated Early Education and Care Children's service to complete your CHC30125 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

Will my training be up to date?

We specialise in Children's Services and National Training Packages are implemented incorporating the latest in Early Childhood research and practice outlined by The Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA).

This includes the NQF (National Quality Framework) including National Care and Education Regulations, National Standards and EYLF- Early Years Learning Framework.


Will my qualifications be recognised?

All learners must complete a minimum of 160 hours workplace experience required with children aged between 0-3 years in a regulated Early Education and Care Children’s service.

* HLTAID012 First Aid unit is not included in the course cost for self- funded students.

CHC30125 Course Costs and Payment Options
